This cross-disciplinary course will introduce you to the most recent approaches to understanding development of Eskimo-Aleut languages along the North Pacific Coast of Alaska, with a particular emphasis on the Unangan (Aleut) and Alutiiq peoples and their languages. We will look at the archaeological, ethnographic, and linguistic evidence of prehistoric population contacts, migrations, and cultural and linguistic exchanges in the Alaskan Pacific Coast region.
