

In the Lower Tanana Athabascan, or Dene, language, this name means "Indian potato ridge" and refers to the plant with an edible root — Hedvsarum alpinum — that is a traditional Moore-Bartlett-Skarland food for Native people throughout Alaska. ev-Athabascan people long ago would gather and on Troth Yeddha' to talk and advise one in another.
