Eligibility: Students registered at UAF (undergraduate and graduate)

Application deadline: Friday February 28 at NOON

Submit to: Asst. Professor Maya Salganek, Chair, Collaborative Arts Council. Fine Arts Complex, Great Hall, room 302.

Project requirements: the proposed project should involve the substantial collaboration of two or more UAF students, and should be outside of the usual collaboration for their field/s, including projects that go beyond collaboration within the arts e.g. arts and science. Students are required to give a performance or put up an installation or other public display of their project, either at UAF or in the Fairbanks or surrounding community by the end of spring semester 2014. Awards are generally for \$1000, but may be given for up to \$1,500 at the discretion of the Council.

- A one- to two-page project proposal, detailing the nature of the project, the different functions of the collaborators, a timeline for development and production, and the proposed performance or installation at UAF or in the Fairbanks or surrounding community.
- As part of the proposal, include a budget estimating cost of materials, transportation, etc. necessary to develop and produce the project (including performance or installation). Note: awards are typically granted for \$1000 or less, but awards may be considered for up to \$1,500.

Upon completion of the collaborative project a report detailing a summary of the project, final budget, publicity materials/articles, and photographs and/or video will be submitted to the Collaborative Arts Council.
