a) Number of students enrolled and graduated AY 2016-17

There were six (6) active students enrolled in the ENVI Certificate in AY 2016-17.

- No students graduated AY 2016-17, but one student is now enrolled part time in the UAF Bachelor of Arts Degree in Rural Development while working.
- Two of these ENVI Certificate students are on track to graduate in the Fall 2017 semester.
- b) Academic performance in ENVI classes as measured by GPA, and total number of seats filled in ENVI classes
 - In AY 2016-17 there was five hundred and thirteen (513)enrolled students (seats) in ENVI courses that were completed with a satisfactory academic performance of a GPA above 2.0
 - One (1) AY 2016-17 ENVI Certificate student was nominated as the CRCD best science student of the year at the annual graduation ceremony in May 2017.
