

- A film analysis, Stand and Deliver, identifying leadership characteristics of the major characters, and what it takes to plan a project (passing the AP Physics Exam) and to implement it, facilitated by JJ Boggs.



Our most recent reading was Wendy Kopp's book, <u>One Day, All Children</u>, which relates her experience turning her senior leadership project into Teach for America. We want our students to see that they, like Wendy, can dream big dreams and achieve them, even as college students.
