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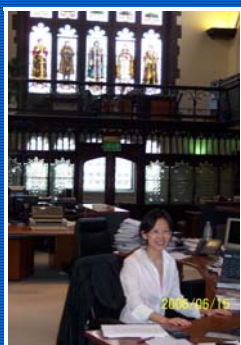

- Create and maintain a strong networking system among UAF NABL members and other AIBL chapters located throughout the U.S.

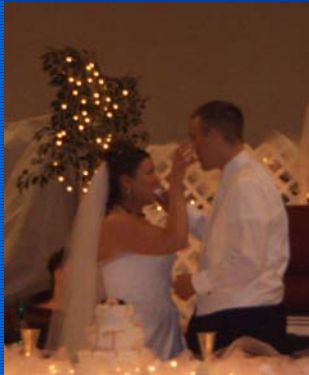

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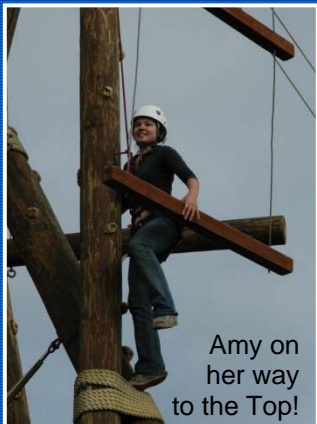
