

Alaska 4-H Shooting Sports Air Pistol Postal Match

General Rules

- Alaska 4-H Code of Conduct will be enforced for all shooting events.
- Participants must be enrolled in the 4-H Pistol Project.
- Participants must shoot for score once each month.
- Participants should have ample time for practice and warm-up, then should complete the round except for a rest period if needed.
- No electronic devices other than noise canceling earmuffs will be permitted on the range (e.g. cell phones, range finders, iPods).
- Rounds must be shot during scheduled month and scores submitted electronically to stwilliver@alaska.edu by the 15th of the following month. Results and statewide scoring will be sent to participating clubs and Extension 4-H faculty each month.
- Participants will pay a \$10 registration fee to cover the administrative costs associated with the Alaska 4-H Shooting Sports Program.

Air Pistol Specific Rules

- The Alaska 4-H Mail-In Tournament supports two classes: Entry Level and National Track. The Entry Level class is meant to use inexpensive equipment with no modification. The National Track class is meant to mirror the equipment that will be supported at the State and National Contests. Rounds

January - 10 Meter Slow Fire Bullseye - Bench Rest Sight-In top left bullseye - 15 record shots from bench rest position -5 shots per bull 150 possible points*

February - 10 Meter Slow Fire Bullseye - Two Hand Standing Sight-In top left bullseye - 15 record shots from two hand standing position - 5 shots per bull. 150 possible points*

March - Meter Rapid Fire Bullseye - Two Hand Standing - 15 record shots as follows; on command, from the standing two hand grip position with the muzzle at rest, raise, aim and fire one round in 3 seconds. 20 second reloading period, repeat for 15 record shots.

150 possible points*

(Jr. class will only shoot 10 record shots - 100 possible points).

Scoring

Any contact of a line results in the higher valued score. *A maximum of 100 additional points will be awarded for safety (50pts) and sportsmanship (50pts). See safety and Sportsmanship scoring guide for more detail.

Awards


Achievement stickers will be awarded based on standardized scoring percentages based on age and track. See results score sheet for details
