General Rules

- Alaska 4-H Code of Conduct will be enforced for all shooting events.
 - Participants must be enrolled in the 4-H Rifle Project.
 - Participants must shoot for score once each month.
 - Participants should have ample time for practice and warm-up, then should complete the round except for a rest period if needed.
 - No electronic devices other than noise canceling earmuffs will be permitted on the range (e.g. cell phones, range finders, iPods).
 - Rounds must be shot during scheduled month and scores submitted electronically to stwilliver@alaska.edu by the 15th of the following month. Results and statewide scoring will be sent to participating clubs and Extension 4-H faculty each month.
 - Participants will pay a \$10 registration fee to cover the administrative costs associated with the Alaska 4-H Shooting Sports Program.

- Smallbore Rifle Specific Rules**
- The Alaska 4-H Mail-In Tournament supports two classes: Entry Level and National Track. The Entry Level class is meant to use inexpensive equipment with no modification. The National Track class is meant to mirror the equipment that will be supported at the State and National Contests. 1. Smallbore Rifle Entry Level (Jr).....	9,10,11
2. Smallbore Rifle Entry Level (Int).....	12,13,14
3. Smallbore Rifle Entry Level (Sr).....	15,16,17,18
4. Smallbore Rifle National Track (Jr).....	9, 10, 11
5. Smallbore Rifle National Track (Int).....	12,13,14
6. Smallbore Rifle National Track (Sr).....	15,16,17,18

**Must compete in same class for all three rounds to score.*

January - 50' Prone (A17 target)

Sight-In Middle Bull
 20 Rounds, one per bull from the prone position.
 Requires two targets
 200 possible points*

February - 50' Kneeling (A17 target)

Sight-In Middle Bull
 20 Rounds, one per bull from the kneeling position.
 Requires two target
 200 possible points*

March - 50 feet CMP, mod. (A17 targets—one shot per bull)

Sight-In center bull.
 Prone 50 feet - 5 slow fire/5 rapid fire
 Sitting or Kneeling 50 feet - 5 slow fire/5 rapid fire
 Standing 50 feet - 5 slow fire/5 rapid fire
 Slow fire=5 shots with Range Officer calling each shot. Rapid fire=5 shots on hot range and shooters discretion.
 300 possible points*

Scoring

Any contact of a line results in the higher valued score.
 *A maximum of 100 additional points will be awarded for safety (50pts) and sportsmanship (50pts). See safety and Sportsmanship scoring guide for more detail.

Awards

Achievement stickers will be awarded based on standardized scoring percentages based on age and track. See results score sheet for details

\$10 per shooter, no limit on number of classes/disciplines
