#### **2023 MARKET LIVESTOCK UPDATE**

Guidelines according to the state veterinarian, Dr. Robert Gerlach

#### **IMPORTANT TO NOTE!**

For each vaccine listed, be sure to note whether it is SUGGESTED or REQUIRED for your animal. If the vaccine is required, proof that it was administered must be submitted on entry day.

Proof consists of the following:

- Name of vaccine
- Manufacturer
- Lot number
- Expiration date: Vaccine shall not be expired when administered.
- Date vaccine administered
- Who administered vaccine

#### Vaccinations — Suggested or Required?

#### Cattle, Feeder Beef and Bison

IBR-Bovine rhinotracheitis — required BVD-Bovine virus diarrhea — required BL3 Parainfluorza 3 — required

PI-3-Parainfluenza 3 — required

Wart vaccine — *suggested* 

#### Reindeer

Clostridial, 7-way — required Respiratory, 3-way — required IBR, BVD, PI3 — required

#### **Sheep and Goats**

CDT-clostridium perfringens type D & tetanus — *suggested* 

#### **Swine**

Erysipelas — *required* (consistent with manufacturer's recommendations)

Things the veterinarian will look for on delivery day: warts, enlarged external lymph nodes (especially on

sheep and goats), infectious or contagious diseases (including external parasites), clinical signs of dermatitis (ringworm) and evidence of castration, when applicable.

You should have the animal in the best physical shape prior to going to the fair. This includes providing good nutrition, vaccinations and parasite control. These precautions will enable the animal to have a strong immune system and avoid getting ill when they are exposed to the other animals

and the stress of being away from home and at the fair.

#### **Important Dates to Remember!**

Quack!

<u>June 10-11:</u> Livestock Showmanship Clinic. Large livestock is Saturday and poultry, rabbits and cavies are Sunday.

<u>July 1</u>: Check on any medicated feeds and all medications for withdrawal dates for all market animals.

July 2-10: Weigh-in Week, Small Animals. Beginning weights of all small animal market projects (turkeys, geese, ducks, chickens, rabbits and cavies) must be turned in to 4-H office along with full-body, close-up picture of animal, date picture taken and 4-H band number (tattoo number for rabbits).

<u>July 7</u>: Organized Weigh-in, Turkeys, Geese and Ducks, 6-7 p.m., at Tanana Valley Fairgrounds, for those who wish to weigh their animals. Banding and photos also to be available.

<u>July 22</u>: Entry Day, 1-6 p.m. at Largen Barn. Buyer contacts and record books due.

July 24: Barn Set-up Day; potluck when work done, 5 p.m. July 27: Delivery of Animals to Fair. Small animals, 2-8 p.m., and large animals, 4-8 p.m. Remember, there will be a vet check before animals can be brought into the barns.

July 28: Mandatory Barn Meeting, 11 a.m.

<u>July 28</u>: Official Fair Weigh-in, noon-2 p.m. <u>Aug. 4</u>: Mandatory Barn Meeting, 11 a.m.

<u>Aug. 6</u>: Animal Pick-up Day and Barn Clean-up, 7 a.m. <u>Aug. 20</u>: Small animals delivered to buyer unless other arrangements with buyer are made.

<u>Sept. 10</u>: Record books turned in to 4-H leader/FFA advisor in order to be eligible for a market project next year.

be open to any of the above mentioned people from across the nation and was advertised at this year's 4-H Volunteer Conference of Southern States held in Georgia.







# 4-H Camp Counselor JOB DESCRIPTION

#### **DUTIES:**

- 1. Be responsible for health, welfare and safety of campers.
- 2. Supervise cabin group during nonscheduled time.
- 3. Supervise all duties of cabin group, such as KP, cleaning showers, bathrooms, cabin, etc.
- 4. Carry out duties as assigned by director or other adult staff.
- 5. Assist with and participate in the discovery group learning phase of the program.
- 6. Take part in planning evening recreation activities, campfires, etc.
- 7. Be in your cabin each night at "quiet time."

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- 1. Be enthusiastically involved in camp.
- 2. Be familiar with the objectives of camp.
- 3. Establish and maintain a rapport with your cabin group.
- 4. Get to know each camper.
- 5. Encourage camper participation in activities and educational programs.
- 6. Promote respect for Twin Bears camp facility and natural surroundings.
- 7. Keep camper morale high.
- 8. Lead by being a good example.
- 9. Deal with discipline and report serious problems to director.
- 10. Show NO favoritism.
- 11. Contact the director or nurse at first signs of injury, illness or irregularities with campers or self.
- 12. Maintain good sense of humor; do not lose temper.
- 13. See that both you and your cabin group get enough sleep.
- 14. Maintain communications with staff.
- 15. Be responsible for keeping cabin clean and orderly.

There is <u>required</u> counselor training: Dates and times will be identified prior to each camp session.

Qualifications:

- 1. Must be willing to follow all rules and behavioral recommendations.
- 2. Must have completed 8th grade and above for Junior Jamboree Camp.\*

- 4. Must enjoy working with younger kids
- 5. It is preferred, but not mandatory, that counselors are enrolled 4-H members.
- 6. Must be able to attend all training sessions and camp.\*\*

- \*\* If you cannot attend the training sessions, you must schedule an appointment with Marla Lowder to cover the material.



#### Exhibit Entry Dates, Exhibit Drop-Off Times and Online Entry

The Tanana Valley State Fair will be using online entry again this year. Online entries are being accepted from now until 7 p.m. the day before the actual drop-off day. Some online entries can be made the same day as drop-off; however, to avoid lines it is recommended that you do it before from the comfort of your home. Go to **TVSFA@org** to do online entry. As has been done the last two years, exhibit tags will be printed on the fairground on drop-off days.

Because we do interview judging, the 4-H member should plan on bringing their entries in themselves on entry days. However, if for any reason the 4-H member can't make it for the interview judging or the family will be out of town on the drop-off day, the superintendent listed at the beginning of this document should be contacted to arrange an earlier drop-off time and location. The fair will not accept any early exhibit drop-offs. However, Department 1, 4-H Club Work will.

Non-perishable drop-off day: Saturday, July 22, 1-6 p.m., Upper Totem Building Perishable drop-off day: Thursday, July 27, 1-5 p.m.

/ Exhibit pick-up day: Monday, Aug. 7, 1-6 p.m.


