










Marla's Roundup



Parent Involvement — Parents are in charge of monitoring their child. This is a clinic/show, which means child care is NOT provided. While I will help in knowing where your child needs to be, it is the

parent's and child's responsibility to read the schedule and make sure your child is where they belong. We have a lot of young 4-H'ers, so appropriate warnings will be made; however, if children are left unattended, I do hold the right to ask you to take your child home. If you are not going to be at the fairgrounds for whatever reason, your child does need to have a chaperone who is willing to be responsible for that child.

Parent Volunteering — To make these shows possible we need volunteers. Please make sure to use the Google doc and fill in a volunteer position. If you need help with the Google doc, feel free to call me. If you do not sign up for a position, one will be assigned to you.

Clinic Attire — Please dress according to the discipline in which you are riding. The clinic may be ridden English or Western, and you may switch on and off. The clinicians do expect that you

are wearing appropriate attire in the clinic sessions. Please dress professionally and appropriately. I do expect no holes in your pants, required are appropriate heeled boots per discipline, and helmets when mounted. CLOSED-TOED SHOES ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL ACTIVITIES!

Horse Show Attire — Saturday is show day. Please look in the rule book, bit.ly/HorseRuleBook, to see what appropriate attire is. Fitting and showing does require you to wear black pants/jeans and a white button down shirt with an appropriate halter for Western attire. As shown in the rule book, it is allowed to do fitting and showing in English attire, and if you choose this option you must show in an English bridle (see page 11). If you have any questions on what flies and what does not, feel free to reach out to myself or your 4-H club leader. For trail, each rider will get one ride, for those who ride both disciplines, you may pick which one you would like to ride.

2022 Livestock Possession Dates

Don't forget the following dates if you checked on the agreement that you are raising one of these animals for market:

Feeder Steer — born on or after Dec. 1 and in possession by April 15

Lamb — born on or after Jan. 1 and in possession by May 1

Swine — born on or after Jan. 1 and in possession by May 1

Goat — born on or after Jan. 1 and in possession by May 1

Turkey — hatched on or after March 15 and in possession by April 15

Goose — hatched on or after March 15 and in possession by April 15

Ducks — hatched on or after May 25 and in possession by June 8

Chickens — hatched on or after May 23 and in possession by June 6

Rabbits — born on or after May 8 and in possession by July 1

2022 MARKET LIVESTOCK UPDATE

Guidelines according to the state veterinarian, Dr. Robert Gerlach

IMPORTANT TO NOTE!

For each vaccine listed, be sure to note whether it is SUGGESTED or REQUIRED for your animal. If the vaccine is required, proof that it was administered must be submitted on entry day. **Proof consists of the following:**

- Name of vaccine
- Manufacturer
- Lot number
- Expiration date: Vaccine shall not be expired when administered.
- Date vaccine administered
- Who administered vaccine

Vaccinations — Suggested or Required?

Cattle, Feeder Beef and Bison

IBR-Bovine rhinotracheitis — required BVD-Bovine virus diarrhea — required PI-3-Parainfluenza 3 — required Wart vaccine — *suggested*

Reindeer

Clostridial, 7-way — required Respiratory, 3-way — required IBR, BVD, PI3— required

Sheep and Goats

CDT-clostridium perfringens type D & tetanus — suggested

Erysipelas — required (consistent with manufacturer's recommendations)

Things the veterinarian will look for on delivery day: warts, enlarged external lymph nodes (especially on

> sheep and goats), infectious or contagious diseases (including external parasites), clinical signs of dermatitis (ringworm) and evidence of castration, when applicable.

> You should have the animal in the best physical shape prior to going to the fair. This includes providing good nutrition, vaccinations and parasite control. These precautions will enable the animal to have a strong immune system and avoid getting ill when they are exposed to the other animals

and the stress of being away from home and at the fair.

Important Dates to Remember!

Quack!

June 4-5: Mandatory Livestock Showmanship Clinic. Large livestock is Saturday and poultry, rabbits and cavies are Sunday.

July 1: Check on any medicated feeds and all medications for withdrawal dates for all market animals.

July 3-11: Weigh-in Week, Small Animals.

Beginning weights of all small animal market projects (turkeys, geese, ducks, chickens, rabbits and cavies) must be turned in to 4-H office along with full-body, close-up picture of animal, date picture taken and 4-H band number (tattoo number for rabbits).

Wool July 8: Organized Weigh-in, Turkeys, Geese and Ducks, 6-7 p.m., at Tanana Valley Fairgrounds, for those who wish to weigh their animals. Banding and photos also to be

July 23: Entry Day, 1-6 p.m. at Largen Barn. Buyer contacts and record books due.

July 25: Barn Set-up Day; potluck when work done, 5 p.m. July 28: Delivery of Animals to Fair. Small animals, 2-8 p.m., and large animals, 4-8 p.m. Remember, there will be a vet check before animals can be brought into the barns.

July 29: Mandatory Barn Meeting,

July 29: Official Fair Weigh-in, noon-2 p.m.

Aug. 5: Mandatory Barn Meet**ing**, 11 a.m.

Aug. 7: Animal Pick-up Day and Barn Clean-up, 7 a.m.

Aug. 21: Small animals delivered


