

4-H Volunteer Checklist 2024-2025

- 1) Complete the Alaska 4-H Volunteer Service Application for your district:
 - a) Anchorage Bethel Bristol Bay Kenai Kodiak Mat-Su Nome Sitka Southeast Tanana
 - b) Successfully pass a background screening: this form is integrated into the volunteer service application.
 - c) If you are a **returning volunteer** and need a new background check that can be completed at bit.ly/BGCheck-Online-Form
- 2) Enroll in Alaska 4-H as an adult volunteer after October 1, at 4h.zsuite.org.
- 3) Complete the following trainings at 4h.zsuite.org/clover-academy (can be started as early as 9/1):
 - a) 4-H Volunteer Training Course (4 modules)
 - b) Protection of Minors
 - c) Civil Rights
 - d) Title IX
 - e) Driver Training
 - i) **If not driving youth:** please sign the <u>Driving Opt-Out</u> form and send to <u>ydp.risk.management@alaska.edu</u>. Skip the next step if you opt-out.
 - ii) This only needs to be completed if you are driving youth.
 - (1) Complete the Driver Training in Clover Academy.
 - (2) Complete the <u>DMV</u> forms and send to your district representative and ydp.risk.management@alaska.edu.
- 4) Clery training at bit.ly/4-HCleryTraining.
