## Department 1, 4-H Club Work at 2023 TVSF — July 26-Aug. 6



The new 4-H year has just started. It is not too early to start planning your exhibits for the 2023 Tanana Valley State Fair in Department 1, 4-H Club

Work. Take a few minutes to look at the exhibitor guide for all the possibilities for exhibits in 4-H Club Work no matter what your project areas are. Examples include contests, exhibits that are a product of your livestock project (a good example of this is exhibiting eggs from your poultry), educational displays describing your project, the photo scavenger hunt or a photo display of your project from start to finish, etc.

For fair 2023, because of the lack of volunteers to fill the Upper Totem Building attendants spots, each 4-H

member that exhibits will be responsible for providing a volunteer to fill a three hour shift. Day passes will be available for those who building sit. Building attendants must be 18 years old or older. It doesn't necessarily have to be a parent; it can be a friend, coworker, neighbor, grandparent, a past 4-H member who is 18 or older, etc., who is willing to help 4-H out. For those who need it to be mandatory before you will do it, it will be mandatory. For all those who would help out either way, thank you for volunteering.

### **Completing the Annual Summary Financial Report**

- 1. The Annual Summary Financial Report provides an overview of your club's financial activities for the 4-H year (October 1 to September 30). At the top of the form, fill in your club name, your bank's name, and the dates covered by the report.
- 2. Line 1, **The Balance at Beginning of Year**, is the amount on hand on the first day of the new 4-H year, or October 1.
- 3. Lines 2 through 6 are where you would report your club's **Income** for the year. Each line should report all the income from a particular activity or event. These should include gifts, donations, sales of goods, fundraisers, dues and/or fees, and other income i.e., grants. Items can be reported all together or separately, such as candy sales and car washes can be combined for fundraisers. <u>For donations over \$5,000</u>, indicate amount and name and mailing address of the individual or business.
- 4. Line 7, **Total Income for Year**, is lines 2 through 6 added together.
- 5. Line 8, **Adjusted Balance**, is your beginning balance (line 1) added to your total income for the year (line 7). This line shows how much money your club had to work with during the year.
- 6. Lines 9 through 14 are your club's **Expenditures** for the year, again grouped by a particular activity or event, i.e., scholarships, educational materials, activity costs/fees.
- 7. Line 15, **Total Expenditures for Year**, is lines 9 through 14 added together. This line will show how much money your club spent during the year.
- 8. Line 16, **Balance at End of Year**, is your total expenditures (line 15) subtracted from your adjusted balance (line 8). This line will show how much money your club has to start the new 4-H year.
- 9. Compare line 16 with your bank statement. They should be the same. If they are not the same it is probably because some checks and/or deposits have not yet cleared the bank. Use line 17 to add the total of all your checks that have not cleared the bank yet to your balance (line 16). Next, use line 18 to subtract the total of all your deposits that have not cleared the bank from your balance (right hand column in line 17). Write your new balance on line 19. The balance should now be the same as your bank statement. If it still doesn't add up, you need to go back and check all your income and expenditure amounts.
- 10. Finally, sign and date the report where it is indicated for the treasurer's signature. Also, have your adult leader sign the report and submit a copy to your club, a copy to your District Extension Office, and keep a copy for your records.

(Please indicate which animal(s) is/are your primary project animal(s).) Fairground weigh-ins: large, May 5, 4–8 p.m.; small, July 7, 6–7 p.m.					
	**Only Tanana District Market Livestock tags/bands will be permitted and must be picked up from the 4-H office.**					
	I will attend one of the Market Livestock Participant Meetings with a parent or guardian, Feb. 18 at 10 a.m. or April 18 at 7 p.m., at the 4-H office.					
	I will attend a Livestock Showmanship Clinic at the club or district level					
	I will ensure my animal(s) has/have all the vaccinations that are required by the Tanana District 4-H Livestock Committee. These are recorded on the Tanana District 4-H/FFA Animal Health Record and Proof of Vaccinations. I will make a copy of it to turn in to the vet on Animal Delivery Day.					
	I will turn in a minimum of three buyer contacts per market project, no later than July 22, 2023. (More are always better!)					
	I must turn in a completed 4-H and/or FFA Alaska 4-H Record Book with a 4-H Livestock Project Insert for each animal species, completed to July 22, 2023, that demonstrates the <u>quality</u> and <u>knowledge</u> of the project (these will be judged as a fair exhibit). I must include a copy of my Market Livestock Project Agreement.					
	I will participate in fair barn/pen set-up and clean-up days on Monday, July 24, and Sunday, Aug. 6.					
	I will have a stall poster, at least 22" x 20", prepared before arriving to the fair. This poster will be judged. Poster requirements will be handed out at the Market Livestock Participant Meetings. Must be hung by July 28 at 10 a.m. and weights added by 6 p.m.					
	Participants will be assessed \$20 per day per animal per violation for the following items: Poster not hung by 10 a.m. July 28; weights not added to poster by 6 p.m. July 28; and/or buyer name not added to poster by 11 a.m. Aug. 5.					
	I will attend the Mandatory Barn Meetings on July 28 at 11 a.m. and Aug. 4 at 11 a.m.					
	During the fair, I will exercise my animal(s) daily, clean (all) my pen(s) between 7 a.m. and 12 p.m. each day, and feed and water my animal(s) morning and evening.					
	I will complete two 2-hour barn duty shifts in the barn where my market animals are housed during the fair.					
	I will conduct myself in a sportsmanlike manner at all times during the fair.					
	I must compete in the TVSF conformation and showmanship class with each animal to be sold at the auction.					
	If my animal(s) is/are withdrawn from the auction, I will continue to care for it/them until it/they is/are released from the fair. Failure to care for my animal(s) may cause me to be barred from future participation in the Market Livestock Program.					
	I will write a thank-you letter to my buyers and add-on donors after the sale. The letter must be addressed, stamped and turned in to the designated person on the day after the auction by 6 p.m. **NO LETTER, NO CHECK.**					
	If I sell small livestock at the auction, I will be responsible for talking with the buyers and finding out how they would like their animals butchered, dressed and delivered. The product is to be delivered to the buyer(s) within 14 days of the fair, unless another date is mutually agreed upon. Failure to deliver the animal in a timely manner may result in my being barred from participation in future Market Livestock Auctions.					
	Judges will make the final decision on whether animals qualify for the Market Livestock Auction. Only animals taking a blue or red ribbon in a conformation class will be eligible for sale at the auction. White ribbons will not go to auction.					
	REMEMBER: All completed market livestock project record books must be turned in to the main 4-H leader/FFA advisor by Sept. 10 for evaluation after project completion. The leaders/advisors will then submit all record books to the 4-H agent/FFA state advisor by Sept. 15 for verification of completed project with any recommendations for Merit/SAE Awards. Failure to do so may result in ineligibility to participate in future Market Livestock Program activities.					
	An amount of up to 6 percent will be withheld from all market livestock checks to cover the costs associated with the auction.
