

A Refresher from Marla

COVID guidelines remain the same since our last newsletter. I would encourage you all to keep up to date with the current CDC guidelines and our state 4-H website at www.alaska4h.org/covid-current-phase-c. for the most recent information.

Here is a recap for those who may need a "refresher:"

Fully vaccinated and not fully vaccinated individuals:

- a. Face masks are required indoors and in university vehicles.
- b. Face masks are required when outdoors if it is not possible to maintain 6 feet of distance from other people.
- c. Face masks are required outdoors when mandated by an event- or location-specific mitigation plan.

Group size — This has not changed; it is still 20. However, remember, if meeting outside you can have multiple pods. They are just not supposed to interact with the other groups.

Room capacity — It is 50 percent as long as social distancing is still attainable.

Cleaning — We are still asking that you do the pre- and post-cleaning at this point to still help stop the spread of anything.

Mitigation plans — These plans are no longer required. For other events, we are falling under the UAF IANRE MIT plan, which can be found at the above website, too.

Office hours — We are open to the public 9 a.m. -1 p.m. and 2-4 p.m. week days. It is suggested that you call ahead of time to make sure someone is available. If you need to meet outside regular office hours, appointments can be made. When you come into the office, and if there are more than three people in the office ahead of you, please wait in the hall until they leave the office.




