



Market Livestock Participants Meetings — Feb. 18 or April 18

If you or your youth are doing a market livestock project, don't forget you have to attend one of the two mandatory meetings. They will be Feb. 18 at 10 a.m. and April 18 at 7 p.m. So, make sure you get one on your calendar to attend.



Youth in Governance — Face-to-Face is Back — March 26-31



We are excited to take our teens back to Juneau and experience the governmental process face to face. If you are a teen between the ages of 14 and 18 and have an interest in government and learning how it works, then here is an opportunity for YOU! Our district has one slot open for one teen and one adult chaperone to attend Youth in Governance, March 26-31, in Juneau. The program will pay most of the expenses with the exception of meals outside the program while in Juneau. There is a \$350 registration fee for both teens and adults. Teens and adults will be in charge of their own transportation to and from Juneau. If more than one teen would like to go and there is a spot not filled from that district, they will be put in for a drawing for that spot. If the program is full and they still want to go, they can attend with a registration fee of \$1,500. To apply to be a participant, please contact Priscilla Rice at plmrice.ak@gmail. com. There is an application process the district has established that you will need to do.

Public Presentation/Demonstration Day — April 8

Start getting ready and preparing for the big day as it will be here before you know it. Public Presentation/Demonstration Day will be held April 8. We will start signups right after spring break in March. So, for now, get the date on your calendar and start thinking about your topic and doing your research.





New Leader Training — April 13

I was asked, and I think it is a good idea, to do this training again. It is not mandatory, but it would be good for new leaders within the past five years or so to attend. Or, it could be a great refresher for you. It will be on April 13 at 6:30 p.m. in Room 108. We will cover simple things like meeting planning, district requirements, etc. I will have a resource manual for you to take home. I hope to see you there.

State Shooting Sports Leader Training in Palmer — April 14-16

There will be a shooting sports training held in Palmer April 14-16. All shooting sports disciplines will be covered. In order to attend, you need to be an up-to-date leader by April 1. Marla will need to know who is attending and what discipline you will be doing. You do not have to do all disciplines; you need only do one. You are responsible for all fees associated with this training, but you can apply for the Leaders Council Scholarship, which is due Feb. 15. It is looking like a \$50 registration fee per discipline.





State Horse Contest in Kenai — April 28-29

The Kenai District will host the state horse contest this year. The dates are going to be April 28 and 29. So, you horse kids save the dates and start studying. There will be horse bowl, horse judging, hippology, demonstrations and public speeches. I am so excited to have another one and to go to Kenai and I hope you are too. So start studying and working as a team — I am really looking forward to seeing you all!

Exciting news! In February of 2024, the Tanana District will host a professional development leaders forum for 4-H volunteers, teens and staff/faculty! This

will be similar in form to the Western Region Leaders' Forum (WRLF) that used to happen for those of you who know as a reference point.

The National 4-H Summit is set for Feb. 28, 29 and March 1, 2024, at the Westmark Fairbanks Hotel and Conference Center in Fairbanks. We only have a capacity of 400 people due to the size of the dining room. It will

be open to any of the above mentioned people from across the nation and was advertised at this year's 4-H Volunteer Conference of Southern States held in Georgia.

There will be 11 concurrent sessions between the Westmark Hotel and the Tanana Valley State Fairgrounds. There will be a specific teen track that we are partnering with Utah State Ambassadors to run. We will host preconference tours and have fun optional activities in the evenings for participants to enjoy.

We have five working groups that are underway: financial, educational, logistics, meals and registration. If anyone would like to help, please reach out to me, Jan Hanscom, Patsy Perkins, Priscilla Rice or Nancy Graff. Each committee will have lots of subcommittees under them in order to make sure things happen. There will be varying amounts of registration scholarships for our district individuals

to attend and will be based on volunteer hours worked. So, it would be good to get involved in a committee ahead of time to get those hours under way and maybe over with.

We look forward to hosting this fun event again and hope you will consider at least attending if not being a part of the hosting team.
