<b>Food and Hay</b> (7-10 day supply) in water-tight containers
<b>Water</b> (7–10 day supply or equipment needed to gain access to water)
Food pans and Water buckets
Bedding (7-10-supply)
Medication (7–14-day supply) in sealed container
Veterinarian records needed for transport, boarding, relocation. EIA (Coggin's test results) for horses to transport or board Rabies vaccination certificates and other vaccination records Other records for prescriptions or detailed medical conditions
Hygiene equipment Waste disposal equipment and containers Disinfectant
