

Livestock Emergency Kit Check List

- Animal identification**
 - Emergency Identification tags to be attached
 - Registration papers, microchip numbers and registration information
 - Photo of yourself and your animals together (documents ownership)

- Farm Inventory List and Livestock Emergency Information Form(s)**

- Equipment to control and move animals safely**
 - Halters, leads, blindfolds for horses, gloves
 - Temporary housing / livestock panels

- Food and Hay** (7-10 day supply) in water-tight containers

- Water** (7–10 day supply or equipment needed to gain access to water)

- Food pans and Water buckets**

- Bedding** (7-10-supply)

- Medication** (7–14-day supply) in sealed container

- Veterinarian records needed for transport, boarding, relocation.**
 - EIA (Coggin's test results) for horses to transport or board
 - Rabies vaccination certificates and other vaccination records
 - Other records for prescriptions or detailed medical conditions

- Hygiene equipment**
 - Waste disposal equipment and containers
 - Disinfectant

- Contact information for help:**
 - Alternative caregiver
 - Transportation
 - Temporary housing/boarding
 - Veterinarian care, State Veterinarian

- Emergency Communication Plan**
 - Written directions to property
 - List of who to call for what, Emergency contact person
