Climate Change & Subsistence Impacts Undergraduate Research Opportunity 2022

The University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF) Department of Alaska Native Studies and Rural Development in partnership with the University of Arizona and Haverford College is seeking undergraduate students from the University of Alaska to participate in a National Science Foundation (NSF) funded research project. Space is limited to 5 students who will engage in two summers of anthropological fieldwork working in partnership with tribal communities from two regions of the state. Students will build research and filmmaking skills and explore how climate change is affecting community subsistence practices.

2022 Course and Field-work Dates/Locations:

Selected students are expected to complete a 3-credit intensive course (May 16-27, 2022) to be held in Fairbanks, AK followed by fieldwork in Arctic Village, AK (May 30-June 17, 2022).

Who Should Apply:

Undergraduate students currently enrolled at a University of Alaska campus who are interested in anthropological fieldwork working in partnership with tribal communities

Tuition and Expenses:

Scholarships will be provided to cover tuition for the 3-credit course, travel to/from Arctic Village, lodging and meals during the intensive and fieldwork, as well as a \$3,000 a year stipend upon commitment to the full project.

Application Deadline:

Complete applications must be received no later than **March 11, 2022**. All applications received after the deadline will not be considered.

Selection Process:

We will notify accepted participants after March 28, 2022.
