Street Light Pole Tagging

In June of 2019, Facilities Services cataloged, geo-located, and tagged over 800 light poles across campus, including the ski trails, Harper Building, U Park, and the agriculture farm. QR code stickers were also applied to facilitate direct communication with Facilities Services Dispatch about problems with the lights. Simply scan the sticker with your smart phone and an email is automatically generated to Dispatch where a work order will be generated to fix the problem. The stickers have worked out very well but over time, exposure to the sun, frost, snow,

and ice have taken their toll. The stickers have deteriorated to where they're faded and torn and many no longer work.

New QR stickers, with state-of-the-art UV coatings to help protect them, have been created by the Sign Shop, and the Preventive Maintenance team is currently removing the old stickers and replacing them with new. The outdated street maps showing the locations of the poles are also being revised. This system will keep UAF a well-lit and safe campus for students, faculty, staff, and visitors.






Small Guy

Gruening Space Optimization






I wanted to make a point to recognize a job well done and give well deserved props to the shops for great coordination and communication, so thank you all!


