LANGUAGES IN OUR MAJOR/MINOR

French — The French program reflects not only the culture of France, but the diversity and richness of the greater Francophone world. Join a close-knit community of French speakers and exchange students from around the world who are here to help you.

German — The language of philosophers, artists and innovators is still vital in today's globalized world. The most widely spoken language in Europe, it is also essential for anyone interested in American culture and history, since Germans represent the largest single heritage group in the U.S.

Japanese — The Japanese program at UAF offers beginning through advanced Japanese language courses as well as Japanese literature and culture courses, which are taught in English. A unique aspect of the major is the study abroad requirement, which enables students to develop advanced language skills while gaining firsthand experience of Japanese culture and society.

Russian — Do you like a challenge? Are you interested in the rest of the world? If so, then study Russian! Learn about a nation that has produced world-class figures of culture and science. Russian is a strategic language that opens doors for many exciting intellectual and career opportunities.

Spanish — The Hispanic population of the U.S. will soon reach 50 million, and more and more companies value employees with a knowledge of Spanish. You can use your Spanish to improve your employment potential, enhance your travel experiences, communicate with almost 500 million people worldwide, and experience the rich cultural and artistic expression of the Spanish-speaking world.

OTHER LANGUAGES OFFERED AT UAF

Arabic — Approximately 225 million people speak Arabic worldwide, and Arabic speakers are increasingly in demand in the international sector. Learn about Arabic language and Islamic life and culture worldwide.

Chinese — China is the second largest U.S. trading partner and is emerging as a world economic power. There is an increasing need for us to understand Chinese language and culture in order to foster better cooperation.

Italian — Italian culture has contributed great art, literature, architecture, music, film, fashion and food! Learn about Italy and its heritage through the study of Italian language, culture and geography.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The BA in foreign language options: (1) requires the study of two languages, their literatures and their cultures, or (2) one language — German, Spanish or French — with a study abroad component highly recommended. Second language not required for option (2). The BA in Japanese studies requires a concentration in the target language and coursework in other departments such as history, geography, political science, anthropology and business. Japanese studies requires a semester in Japan.

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Review the admission requirements at www.uaf.edu/admissions/.
2. Click the "apply now" link for directions on the application process or proceed directly to the online application for admission through UAOnline at <http://uaonline.alaska.edu>.
3. Once on UAOnline select "Apply for Admission or Check on Status of Application" and follow the directions on the screen.

The department does not require language proficiency tests for entrance into the degree program. However, if an incoming student wishes to enroll in language courses at a level higher than introductory level, they must have AP credits, transfer credits or produce language proficiency test scores (CLEP or FLAT) sufficient to meet the desired course's prerequisites.
