Make a Berry Field Guide

Learn to identify a few of Alaska's berry species by making a field guide!



Field guides are books that help you identify plants or animals in nature. They can help you tell the difference between two species that look similar. For plants, field guides are important to identify which ones are poisonous.

Materials:

Field Guide Printable, *Alaska Berries* sheet, coloring materials (crayons, colored pencils, markers, etc).




Instructions:



Step 1: Color the berry pictures. Use the pictures on the *Alaska Berries* sheet as a guide.

Step 2: Fold your sheet in half lengthwise along the dotted line. Then fold in half along the vertical dotted line, with the cover page on top. You now have a mini field guide!



Step 3: Take your field guide outside and practice identifying berry species!

<u>Caution</u>: This field guide is for informational purposes only. <u>Never</u> eat a berry until you know it is safe! If you are not sure, check with an expert or a professional guidebook, such as *Alaska's Wild Berries* by Verna E. Pratt.
