

# Screencasting for Clarity

*Use Jing to answer questions & solve problems*

Screencasting makes it easy to reduce repetitive emails; put your voice in your courseroom; pinpoint problems and develop quick videos to address them; reach students by showing them what you mean.

Never heard of screencasting? It's simply a movie of what you see on your screen. If a student or colleague asks how to do something, you can record your steps and save them. Share the movie with that person and save the movie to share with others with similar questions.

TechSmith, the creators of Jing, provide two GB of storage and bandwidth per month for free. You can save your movies to your computer or to screencast.com.

The true strength of this product is the ability to show a person exactly what you mean. Once you've made a video to explain the steps you can share it by a link, as an attachment to an email, or via embedding the video.

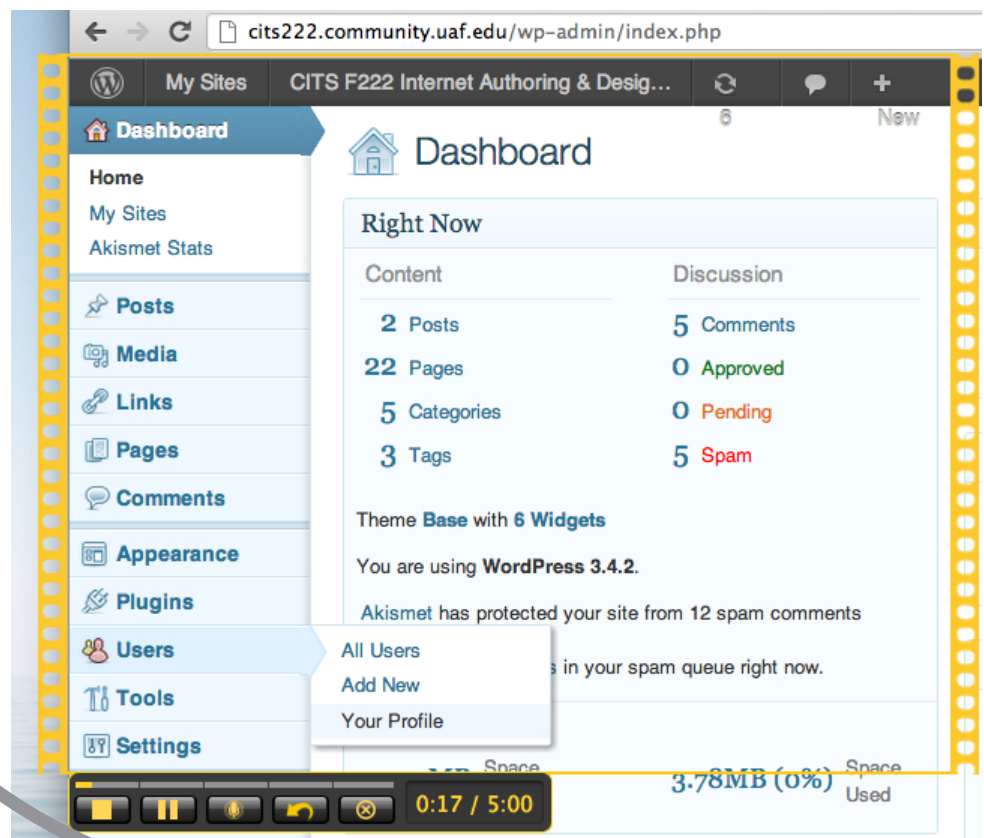
