SlideRocket is a free Flash-based presentation app that allows you to recreate a PowerPoint in the browser or import a presentation created with other software and take advantage of the web's sharing and mashup capabilities.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

SlideRocket is an online slide presentation software which can be used to display presentations, and to create them. SlideRocket uses flexible software to manage the creation of presentations. The software also offers users an opportunity to view their presentations from anywhere, tablets, mobile phones or any browser.


