# **Course Objective:**

To acquaint new and prospective Natural Resources Management majors with the NRM degree and provide an overview of career opportunities and requirements for employment in professional natural resource related occupations.

Students with similar career interests will be divided into groups. As a group, you will gather information related to available positions within the natural resources area you have selected. The last week of the semester you will present as a group, career opportunities within your interest area in the state and elsewhere, required qualifications, the application process and other relevant information.
