What is an ORCID iD?

Open Researcher and Contributor Identifier (ORCID) provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from every other researcher and, through integration in key research workflows such as manuscript and grant submission, supports automated linkages between you and your professional activities ensuring that your work is recognized.

ORCID iDs are required for PIs on individual fellowship and career development applications submitted for due dates on or after January 25, 2020. Fellowship or career development award applicants must register for an ORCID iD and link it to their eRA Commons personal profile.

ORCID iDs are a digital identifier unique to each researcher. Workflow integrations allow this unique ID to create a link between the researcher and key research activities. For more information, <u>read NOT-OD-19-109</u> and <u>visit NIH's website to view a video on how to get an ORCID</u>.

OGCA strongly encourages early adoption of the ORCID iD for anyone intending to apply for NIH or NSF funding.
