Intended Objectives/Outcome	Assessment Criteria and Procedures	Implementation
1. Educate Students	Students will demonstrate an understanding of the origins of criminal behavior, society's response to crime, and the consequences of crime to our society.	Admit students to the program, all students to enroll in Core courses JUST 110, 125, 251, 310, 358. Continue through program curriculum.
2. Prepare students for the workforce.	Place approximately five Justice students in internships with criminal Justice agencies each semester.	Register students each semester in JUST 475. (Internship)
3. Connect theoretical Justice practices to Justice functions in Rural Alaska	All students enroll and complete JUST 340, Rural Justice in Alaska	Eligible students and registered for JUST 340 as a core course.
4. Engage students and/or faculty and community in Justice-related current issues.	Demonstrated engagement, professional internship, coordination with UAF office students' rights/responsibilities, coordination of the Fairbanks Community Restorative Justice initiative (FCRJ).	Demonstration of student placements, Quarterly Report of FCRJ participants, Faculty 180 Reports
