Students who complete an AAS degree in Community Health will possess strong performance skills in the areas of communication, critical thinking, computation, and human relations that provide improved self esteem that translates to their role as a primary care provider in their village clinic. 2. A flexible delivery system for meeting the needs of the Community Health Practitioners for home based study. 3. To encourage a larger percentage of the CHPs to obtain their AAS degree. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. An annual survey of graduates that measures their satisfaction with these performance skills. At least 85% of the graduates will be satisfied. 2a. UAF/CRCD will offer multiple courses in each general education category per semester by appropriate technology for students to take in their rural community. 2b. UAF will offer at least one 200 level CHP or Health course each semester by appropriate technology for students to take in their rural community. 3. 100% of CHP certificate program graduates receive an advising session and supporting material on the AAS CH program. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Create a survey for students and administer to graduates since 2005. 2a&b. Count the courses in the catalog that qualify. 3a. Produce and distribute each semester advising materials and information on distance courses for CHAs/CHPs to take for the AAS degree.
