Addictions Counseling Concentration and Behavioral Health Concentration

- Successfully complete two human service practicums at an approved human service site. Each practicum will include a minimum of 125 hours of supervised work experience.
- Demonstrate a working knowledge of the addictive and mental health processes.
- Demonstrate the ability to facilitate various group counseling sessions.
- Demonstrate positive basic attending skills when providing human services.
- Complete a human services portfolio that supports the student's readiness to begin work in the field of human services.

Interdisciplinary Concentration

- Demonstrate a working knowledge of beginning level human service work skills.
- Demonstrate the ability to apply human service values, ethics, and theories to the practice of delivering human services.
- Demonstrate the ability to document client interaction by completing agency documentation.
- Demonstrate the ability to complete a comprehensive assessment and treatment plan.
- Successfully complete two human service practicums at an approved human service site. Each practicum will include a minimum of 125 hours of supervised work experience.
