

Consider a Minor in Education


A minor is ideal for students interested in exploring the possibilities of a career in education. The coursework provides a set of experiences that will help students decide if they want to be teachers before entering a certification program.

With the minors in elementary and secondary, students can substitute those courses required in the minor for some courses in the post baccalaureate licensure programs.

A minor in general education would also benefit any students interested in education and issues involving children. Parents and concerned citizens will benefit from the critical perspective and insights such a range of courses provides. Students majoring in other disciplines will find this minor useful, for example:

- Anthropology, sociology and linguistics majors interested in applied research in educationally related areas
- Psychology and social work majors who will be working with families and school personnel
- History and philosophy majors interested in the history of childhood and schooling

Education Minor-Elementary is a minor designed for students who intend to pursue a license in elementary education at the graduate level. A student, who completed this option with a grade of C or better for each course, will be allowed to substitute this minor for ED 624, 625, and 626 in the post-baccalaureate Elementary Post Baccalaureate Licensure Program available on the UAF campus.
