# **SUPPLIES:**

<u>The materials fee covers:</u> heavy weight hot-pressed (smooth) watercolor paper, hand pencil sharpener, 6"CThru ruler, eraser shield, kneadable and white erasers, 3 graphite drawing pencils, tracing paper, sketch paper

Available to use in class: plant presses, jeweler's loupes, plant holder, many Faber Castell Polychromos colored pencils, electric pencil sharpeners, tracing paper, light tablet, sketch paper, basic tube watercolors and watercolor pencils, water cups, brushes,

<u>Bring:</u> colored pencils, Faber Castell Polychromos pencils are highly recommended, or Prismacolor. I will send you a list of suggested colored pencils, for making the complex colors you see in nature. You can add to what you may have, or borrow from the class. Bring a work lamp. A portable light source helps to produce consistent shadows on the plant. I use inexpensive LED lamp. Many styles are available locally and online.

# **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Drawing our local *Rosa acicularis* wild roses in this workshop designed to introduce you the practice of botanical drawing. We will examine a variety of traditional and contemporary botanical illustrations to recognize different styles and media. Then exploring with graphite and colored pencils, as well as watercolor--will help you learn techniques to achieve a degree of realistically colorful detail.

Students will explore parts of their plants separately, observing carefully, making notes and creating a study page. After doing sketches, we will measure as accurately to draw the correct proportions in the initial stages of line drawing. Reference photos will be taken and the drawings will be developed through adding tonal values. Finally students will make color keys to match natural color and add layers of watercolor and colored pencil to complete their Wild Rose drawings.
