# Spotlight on a few courses offered this spring for those investigating the Entertainment industry:

# FLM F121 3 Credits (35653) Fundamentals of Acting

This class introduces basic stage acting techniques for people with little or no prior acting experience. The course will emphasize physical, emotional, and imaginative awareness and will include monologue and scene work, character analysis and improvisation.

# FLM F231 3 Credits (35655) Previsualization & Preproduction for Digital Cinema

Previsualization is a collaborative process that generates preliminary versions of shots or sequences, predominantly using 3D animation tools and a virtual environment. It enables filmmakers to visually explore creative ideas, plan technical solutions and communicate a shared vision for efficient production. Laying a foundation for cinema production, this course will explore screenwriting, storyboarding, previsualization animation, animatics and film pre-production approaches. This course will focus on developing original stories for animation or dramatic film productions.

## FLM F260 3 Credits (33642) Digital Video Editing

This special offering will use Adobe Creative Cloud, focusing on editing for "narrative" works.

Introduction to the technical and aesthetic aspects of non-linear digital video editing. Students will go from little or no experience in non-linear editing to being comfortable with some of the advanced editing techniques.
