- Rafaela Stacheter (Cameraperformer) with the Virtual Theatre Research Team. Are YOU ready for your Close-up?


Get involved in the SDA Student Drama Associaiton



A Note From The Guest Scenic Designer

The scenic design for Twelfth Night is a result of the collaborative efforts of the design and production team, including director Anatoly Antohin, costume designer Tara Maginnis, lighting designer and technical director Kade Mendelowitz and myself. What evolved was "a performance space about performance spaces." Its extended thrust stage, runways, proscenium towers of scaffolding, curtain swags of bare light bulbs, and Baroque proscenium plaque recall the conventions of a wide variety of performance spaces.

It is the Elizabethan playhouse with a Brechtian twist, employing runways purloined from Kabuki, Noh and burlesque theatres, topped of with bare light bulbs borrowed from Barnum and Bailey, a proscenium emblem from The Covent Garden and striped awnings and deck chairs direct from Atlantic City and Coney Island.

Theoretically speaking, it is a space that allows itself and everything that happens within it to be transformed, to be redefined and over-layed with another set of meanings. In a sense, it is what French philosopher and historian Michel Foucault described as a hetereotopic space. In his article entitled "Of Other Spaces," he describes it thus: "The heterotopia is capable of juxtaposing in a single real space, several spaces, several sites that are in themselves, incompatible. Thus it is that the theatre brings onto the rectangle of the stage, one after another, a whole series that are foreign to one another."
