


- Increasing activity on Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram




## OUTREACH THIS COMING SUMMER


- Boost outreach to undergrads by:

  - Artist-in-Residence


## BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH ALASKA NATIVE COMMUNITIES

- Amanda Young has been communicating with Tia Tidwell, a professor of Alaska Native studies at UAF who is from Anaktuvuk Pass
  - Bringing in another UAF professor from Anaktuvuk Pass who focuses on rural health and has research duties as part of her position
- Renaming Toolik buildings with tundra-inspired names and Nunamiut translations
  - Reaching out to <u>Simon Paneak Memorial</u> <u>Museum and North Slope Department of</u> <u>Iñupiat History Language and Culture</u>

- Amanda began an Alaska Native Resource
  Library in Community Center
  - Crucial to boost understanding of AK Native history/present and of best practices for knowledge co-production
  - Books in camp, language learning resources, podcasts on Indigenous rights










### **FUTURE TRAININGS**
