Land Acknowledgement



We acknowledge the Alaska Native nations upon whose traditional lands our field station operates. In Fairbanks, our Logistic Offices are located on the traditional lands of the Troth Yeddha' Dena people of the Lower Tanana River. We acknowledge that Toolik Field Station and the surrounding areas are located on the ancestral hunting grounds of the Nunamiut, and occasional hunting grounds and routes of the Gwich'in, Koyukuk, and Iñupiaq peoples. What to expect?



- Summer reservations due March 31
- TFS rate increase in 2024 to \$124/night
- Logistics and transportation to operate as in 2023:
 - North and south trucks will run on Tuesdays and Thursdays weekly.
 - Dalton Highway Express will run north on Fridays and south on Saturdays during June-July peak.
 - **Arrival days to the station are Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday**. Other arrival days should be coordinated with the station manager.
 - Toolik Taxi Service will be limited. Please coordinate with station managers well in advance.

Logistics



- Pre-departure forms for COVID, drivers
 - Sent out 1 week prior to departure to email address on myToolik profile
- Shipping
 - Samples SRS needs to be submitted 24 hours prior to southbound truck
 - More communication about supplies/sample shipping is always better. Never too early to begin coordinating.
- Reach out to logistics if you plan to bring more than two 50 lb bags

Proposed COVID plan



- Similar model as 2023, no quarantine, modest changes
- Attestation of vaccination or exemption is still required.
- **Before traveling**: provide proof of 2 negative rapid antigen tests, taken 48 h and 24 h before driving up to Toolik
 - Pre-departure test results will be collected via the same Google Form used in 2023, emailed at least 48 h before departure to email on myToolik profile
- **Post-arrival:** take 1 rapid antigen test on their 5th day at the station
 - Bring 2 more tests in case of an outbreak
 - Residents are encouraged to wear a face mask for their first 7 days at the station but can go about their business normally
- Projects are responsible to provide COVID antigen tests for their personnel
 - This is an allowable grant expense. Need a total of 5 per person per reservation.

Proposed COVID Plan

- Last series in and the series of the series
- We will try to separate housing for new arrivals from established residents, but this may not always be possible.
- If a station resident contracts COVID at Toolik, they will isolate in their room until they can be cleared no more sick bays.
 - We will attempt to relocate roommates, but this may not be possible if population is high.
 - Residents can depart the station if they can provide their own transportation.
- Those who have been in close contact with a confirmed COVID case may be required to undergo further testing and socially distance from others.
- Personal responsibility makes this protocol work:
 - Travellers should be aware of the risks of COVID-19 during travel and protect themselves. Wear a mask during travel. Avoid large gatherings.
 - Understand that residents could contract COVID-19 any time while at Toolik

Tower holding tank replacement


- This season, the tower holding tanks closest to the WeatherPorts will be replaced. There will be an upgrade to this tower facility.
- This tower will remain out of order until upgrades are completed.
- Expected completion: ~June 6.

Central waste tank

replacement

- The central holding tank for the dining facility will also be replaced in 2024.
- Major construction effort throughout August - September
- Road closures to foot & vehicle traffic:
 - Directly to the west of the dining facility across from the community center front door
 Expected completion: mid-September
