The purpose of the department and campus-wide curriculum committees is to scrutinize course change and new course applications to make sure that the quality of UAF education is not lowered as a result of the proposed change. This course would now be offered as a 2 credit course, meeting two hours per week in a lecture/discussion format. The reduction in contact hour and credit reflects the fact that a significant component in the course—the examination of bibliographic sources—has increasingly become an online database activity involving study directed outside of the classroom. The remaining topics and lecture can be accommodated fully within two contact hours per week. Also, the reduction in credit for MUS 601 provides more room in the program credits for a proposed new required course, MUS 632 Topics in Music Theory (3 credits), which is anticipated for Spring 2013.

The changes to the course description reflect:

- 1) change in number of course credits
- 2) that the course will now be offered only in Spring semesters
- 3) change in the prerequisites, in response to the Spring-only offering. The former prerequisite, including "provisional admission to graduate study", applied when the course was offered only in Fall, as incoming first-year students enrolling in the course had yet to complete all Department audition and entrance exam requirements. Given the proposed Spring semester offering, this situation no longer exists, and the prerequisite has been modified accordingly.
