Course Goals

MUS 131 Basic Theory is a course designed to:

- advance your knowledge of the function and interaction of musical element and familiarize you with standard music symbols, terminology and classifications.
- develop skills for clear, precise music notation.
- introduce basic techniques for music analysis.
- provide experience with a variety of musical styles, periods and genres.

Student Learning Outcomes:

- you will be able to describe and understand music from a more accurate and informed perspective utilizing specific music symbols, terminology and classifications.
- you will be able to transcribe music and compose short musical examples using standard music notation and formats.
- you will be able to analyze music using a variety of symbols and graph techniques for representing melodic, harmonic and rhythmic functions.
- you will gain a broader perspective of music through score study and audio examples involving representative musical works by significant composers

Course Policies:

MUS 131 Basic Theory meets each Monday, Wednesday, Friday morning 9:15-10:15 in room 301 of the Music Department. Regular attendance is important for successfully mastering the skills and concepts presented in the course.
