## II. IDENTIFICATION OF THE ENDORSEMENT

#### A. DESCRIPTION OF THE ENDORSEMENT

#### 1. Occupational Endorsement Title:

Wildland Fire Science Occupational Endorsement

#### 2. Admission Requirements and Prerequisites:

Admission is open to all individuals with an interest in pursuing a career in Wildland Fire. This includes students that are new to the field as well as students who are currently involved in Wildland Fire in some capacity.

Students must have a high school diploma or GED, or be enrolled in a university sponsored Tech Prep or Early College program. No previous training or work experience is required, although some familiarity with wildland fire work and the strength to operate a wildland chainsaw and pump is recommended.

#### 3. Course Descriptions:

## FIRE F151 3 credits Wildland Firefighter I

Designed to provide entry-level wildland firefighters the skills and knowledge to safely function as a member of a firefighting crew. Course includes fundamental knowledge of wildland fire organization, fire behavior, suppression methods, safety, and the incident command system. (3+0) Offered Spring

#### FIRE F152 3 credits Wildland Firefighter II

Provides wildland firefighters with knowledge and skills in the deployment, use, safe practices and field maintenance of engine powered wildland firefighting tools including portable pumps and chain saws. (2.5 + 1) Offered Spring

## FIRE F153 2 credits Wildland Firefighter III

Designed to meet the training needs of the Advanced Wildland Firefighter. Includes training in the use of fireline reference materials, recognition and mitigation of safety issues, and provides a solid foundation of basic leadership skills. (2+0) Offered Fall

## FIRE F157 3 credits Wildland Air Operations

Introduction to aircraft types and capabilities, aviation policy and safety for flying in and working with agency aircraft, tactical and logistical uses of aircraft, and requirements for helicopter take-off and landing areas. This course is designed to provide student proficiency in all areas of the tactical and logistical use of helicopters to achieve efficiency and standardization. Topics include aviation safety, aircraft capabilities and limitations, aviation life support equipment, aviation mishap reporting, pre-flight checklist and briefing/debriefing, aviation transportation of hazardous materials, crash survival, helicopter operations. Emphasis is on aviation safety. (3+0) Offered Fall
