The currently required ANTH F320W, "Language and Culture: Applications to Alaska" has not been taught by a member of the anthropology faculty for years (it is taught in ANS). All of the other specific course requirements for the minor are for 200-level courses offered in the anthropology department and always taught by anthropology faculty, unlike ANTH 320W, which is a higher level course, creating a disparity in representation of the linguistic anthropology subfield.
