The purpose of this change is to increase the number of course offerings to satisfy the distribution requirements for the Asian Studies Minor Program. Currently students must have a minimum of 15 credits of coursework distributed among at least three departments and include material on at least two Asian countries. Students are also strongly urged to include a semester of an Asian language. Due to faculty retirements and changes, there are courses in the catalogue that are no longer being offered on a regular basis. Accordingly, I propose to add the following courses as options to fulfill the requirements for the Asian Studies Minor Program: The department of Anthropology's courses Siberia-Past, Present and Future (ANTH 302) and North Asian World Views (ANTH 475)\*; and the department of Political Science course Peace, War, and Security (PS 302). A substantial portion of this course is dedicated to security issues in Asia, including topics such as nuclear proliferation in India, Pakistan and China; ethnic conflict in Sri Lanka and China; and U.S.-China relations. Students taking this course focus their term papers and presentations on a security concern related to an Asian country or the Asian region. I also propose to remove the course Women and Gender in East Asian History (HIST/WMS 414). The faculty member who once taught the course is no longer at UAF and the course has not been offered for the past 5 years. Needless to say, the addition of these courses will add a new range of topics that will greatly enrich the overall Asia Studies Program.
