The UAF Faculty Senate passed a motion to publicize grading policy concerning "C" grades at Meeting #171 on December 6, 2010.

The UAF Faculty Senate urges instructors of letter-graded, <u>undergraduate</u> courses to publicize and distribute to students on the first day of class UAF regulations with regard to the grades of 'C' and below, as applicable to the course taught. These include the material in the table listed below. [*Emphasis added*]

Grading policy concerning "C" grades was modified at Meeting #191 on May 6, 2013. The modified grading policy states:

C- (1.7) shall be the minimum acceptable grade that <u>undergraduate</u> students may receive for courses to count toward the major or minor degree requirements, or as a prerequisite for another course. [*Emphasis added*]

NOTE: The minimum GPA in a major is still 2.0. Individual programs may still establish more stringent requirements.

The modified policy is effective beginning Fall 2013.
