AA degree: three problems (a) supposed to be restricted to 200 level & below, (b) UAF Ethics classes require Junior standing or above; UA General Education classes are supposed to be lower level, 'introductory' classes. We restricted UAF GenEd (last year) to 200 level & below which require no prereqs other than Engl 111.

### "Associate of Arts Degree Requirements 2016 Catalog

The associate of arts degree represents the completion of broad-based college study. This degree may serve as a starting point for your career or as a steppingstone to a bachelor's program. You may earn only one A.A. degree. The curriculum of the associate of arts degree consists of all courses required to meet the UAF baccalaureate core, with the following exceptions:

- 1. The upper-division writing and oral-intensive courses are not required. [because they're upper division]
- 2. In place of the **upper-division ethics course** a humanities or social science elective may be substituted.

All credits for the A.A. degree must be at the F100 level or above, with 20 credits at the F200 level or above, and be distributed as follows:

Part of the problem is 'academic': it was (kinda) ok to leave 300-level ethics as part of 'core', but the Gen Ed requirements are really really supposed to be lower-division classes. Part of it is 'student options'—why shouldn't the student be able to take any class (and not just soc sci) as a sub for 'ethics?

Or maybe I'm creating a mountain from nothing...

#### Solution??

- (a) Ethics is 'baccalaureate requirement' (like the O,W + capstone) not 'Gen Ed'
- (b) Replace 'Ethics' in AA with '+ 1 additional Arts, Humanities, or Soc Sci'
