
JUSTIFICATION FOR ACTION REQUESTED

The purpose of the department and campus-wide curriculum committees is to scrutinize course change and new course applications to make sure that the quality of UAF education is not lowered as a result of the proposed change. The English Department is in the process of revising its undergraduate curriculum. The Department seeks alignment with current trends in literary study by replacing traditional period courses in British and American literature with a slate of courses allowing instructors to approach literature in diverse ways: through the study of a single author, focus on a genre or particular theme, or attention to literature emerging from a specific time and place. Fourteen courses at the 400-level will be dropped; ten 400-level courses will replace them.

English majors must complete five elective courses at the 300- and 400-level; we will offer the same number of 300- and 400-level courses each semester under the new as we have offered under the current curriculum.
